You would think the opposite, with "men's hearts failing them for fear, and for looking after those things which are coming on the earth" (Luke 21:36), but alas, "They have not known nor understood: for he hath shut their eyes, that they cannot see; and their hearts, that they cannot understand" (Isaiah 44:18). And that is why my wife and I are here... "To open their eyes, and to turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan unto God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins" (Acts 26:18).

So, Discipleship continues online, as do the church services. But our people are very disconnected, and struggling, as I am sure all your people are too. And worst of all, the general population here in Ireland are being changed, and by that I mean that they are being <u>conformed</u> to living under the almost absolute rule of the State "for their benefit." It has been coming for a long time, but I never thought I would see it so easily implimented.

Building Projects Continue. During the many extended lockdowns over the past 9 months, several of our people have been working hard on upgrading our church buildings! It has been a delight to at least get these things done: We finished building a new and extensive attic/storage loft that allowed us to renovate a downstairs room into a wonderful Fellowship Hub for between service times; We finished our two new top-notch bathrooms; We insulated the Children's Church area so that it is much warmer; And upgraded our sound and video systems for our "online presence", as well as put in a new fire alarm system! All needed to be done, and the Lord helped us do it all!
